The Karoo shoulder bag - 330 mm (h) x 100 mm (w) x 275 mm (l)

The Karoo shoulder bag was made with vegetable tanned top grain leather +-2.4mm (5-6oz) thickness.


Start your project by first preparing all of the parts as per the Parts summary page 10.

Once you are ready to assemble, take a careful look at the pictures below to understand where each part fits.

It is not a difficult project it just takes a bit of time to assemble, but well worth it in the end.

Picture 1: The A4 pattern is assembled and stuck down to the leather with masking tape. Start punching the holes, cut out the pieces and start the assembly.













The tools required for this build are:

- a) Printer to print Black & White PDF files onto A4 sized paper
- b) Stanley knife with sharp new blades
- c) Waxed thread 1mm and 2 (two) matching harness needles (it does not require sharp points)
- d) Leather hole punch 1.5mm, 3mm & 4mm.
- e) Round hole punch -1×17 mm
- f) Oblong punch 25mm x 5mm & 22 x 5mm
- g) Vegetable tanned leather with thickness of +-2.4mm (5-6oz) was used (Strongly recommended).
- h) D-rings 2 X 30mm
- i) Trigger hooks 2 X 12mm (w) length 65mm
- j) Buckle 1 X 25mm (w) Length 30mm
- k) Tubular rivets 25 X 9 mm
- I) Patience, passion and a love for working with leather, of which I am sure you have more than enough!

<u>Tips:</u>

- 1) Take your time and prepare all the parts for this project before you start the assembly process.
- 2) Now carefully look at the pictures above to see where every part must go. It is actually very easy to build, and I cannot wait to see what your project looks like.

Printing the pattern:

Check out the – **Printer Setting Page**. The (yellow coloured circles) indicates which boxes must be checked to ensure that the correct printing size is selected, before you print the – **Test Page** - . (This is very important)

Once the – **Test Page** – is printed, measure both the vertical and horizontal sides with a ruler to ensure it is correct, before you print the actual pattern pages.

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
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
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
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
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























Shoulder Bag Trapezoid shape



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
The Trapezoid Shoulder Bag - 210 mm (I) x 100 mm (w) x 160 mm (h)

The Trapezoid shoulder bag was made from one solid piece of with vegetable tanned top grain leather +-2.4mm (5-6oz) thickness.


It is not a difficult project it just takes a bit of time to assemble, but well worth it in the end.

Picture 1: The A4 pattern is assembled and stuck down to the leather with masking tape. Start punching the holes.



Picture 2: Wet the leather and then fold on each of the dotted lines. Try and get the folds to be precise as possible and let it dry a bit before starting with the stitching.



Picture 3: The completed bag (Adding the rest of the parts of the bag with Tubular rivets are quick and easy) The Shoulder strap is also very easy to make.





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- b) Stanley knife with sharp new blades

- c) Waxed thread 1mm and 2 (two) matching harness needles (it does not require sharp points)
- d) Leather hole punch 1.5mm & 4mm.
- e) Oblong punch 18mm x 4mm
- f) Vegetable tanned leather with thickness of +-2.4mm (5-6oz) was used (Strongly recommended).
- g) D-rings 2 X 15mm
- h) Trigger hooks 2 X 10mm (w) length 48mm
- i) Buckle 1 X 13mm (w) Length 22mm
- j) Tubular rivets 8 X 9 mm
- k) Patience, passion and a love for working with leather, of which I am sure you have more than enough!
